The Federal Carbon Tax that is anticipated to come into effect on July 1, 2012 is already claiming to cause havoc for many areas of every day living, including housing, businesses, hospitals and individuals.

What is the Carbon Tax?

Carbon Tax will be introduced for the first time in Australia on July 1, 2012. This will ensure bigger businesses will transform their existing products to greener alternatives, putting them back into the mainframe business sector.

Doesn't that benefit everyone with a greener alternative to pollution and a lower rate on products?

The Department of Climate Change and Energy Efficiency states that jobs will be created in the renewable industry. But what about your industry? As long as your business doesn't produce large amounts of gas emissions, you may only have to pay a small Carbon Tax. The Federal Government has advised for every tonne of pollution emitted \$23 will be taxed, with a 2.5% rise every year for three years. The Federal Government has stated \$30 billion of the taxed money will be reinvested in renewable industries.
