The expenses you claim are either deductible for the financial year you incurred them or over a number of years.

The following is a list of expenses you can claim in the financial year that you paid them:

- advertising
- bank fees and charges
- electricity
- employee wages and superannuation
- hire or lease of plant and equipment

- home office expenses
- phone expenses
- repairs
- transport and freight.

To note

For some expenses claimed for a home office, you may have to pay capital gains tax when you sell your house. Speak with a tax accountant to discuss what expenses you can claim if working from home that won't require a capital gains tax payout later on.
